FAQs about Bus Trips

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call promptly when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel a trip **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*

Bus Trips

Sunday, August 6, 1:15 PM Transportation to the Old Manse in Concord for Free Outdoor Concert, *Bound For Glory*. The Folk Song Society of Greater Boston is once again presenting the Woody Guthrie tribute "Bound for Glory" at the Old Manse in Concord. Enjoy great music while seated under a tent; concert lasts from 2:00 – 4:00 PM. No bus fee.

Tuesday, August 8, 2:00 PM Ice Cream Trip to Great Brook Farm in Carlisle. Great Brook Farm has lovely walking paths, a pretty little pond, and farm animals to visit as well as great ice cream! No bus fee.

Thursday, August 10, 12:20 PM Luncheon Cruise down the Sudbury River. Enjoy a relaxed 1½ hour cruising and dining experience on a pontoon boat, where you might see turtles, blue herons, geese, ducks and other wildlife along the river banks. You'll also learn about and see other points of interest in Concord. Cost includes a lunch of sandwich with ice tea or lemonade, fruit and dessert. Cost is \$37.00 per person; this includes the gratuity (please bring cash). No bus fee. ***Unless there is a waiting list, residents will be charged the full price if they cancel at any time. Please note: residents must be able to walk down a ramp and step onto the boat. The boat seats are low, and residents must be able to get in and out of the seat unaided.***

Friday, August 11, 11:00 AM Transportation to Verrill Farm. A quick, five minute drive from Newbury Court will bring us to Verrill Farm. They carry fresh produce, baked goods, an impressive array of cheeses, flowers, gift items such as jams, jellies, tea towels as well as a large, refrigerated section with precooked meals to go. In addition, they have a deli counter where you can order a sandwich or a panini and enjoy a lunch there. No bus fee.

Tuesday, August 15, 9:15 AM Trip to Cape Ann Museum in Gloucester with lunch out. Bill Cross (son of Newbury Court resident Sally Cross) will give us a guided tour of the highlights of the museum as well as their current exhibit, *Rock Bound: Painting the American Scene on Cape Ann and Along the Shore*. The Museum's fine art collection includes the largest grouping of works by native son and renowned marine artist, Fitz Henry Lane, as well as work by other prominent painters and sculptors who lived on, visited or were inspired by Cape Ann. The work of contemporary Cape Ann artists is also collected and exhibited. The permanent collection includes fine and decorative arts, and artifacts from the major industries of the area - the fisheries and granite quarrying.

With paintings drawn from private collections and the Museum's own holdings,

Rock Bound will explore the ways in which an array of artists of the early 20th century sought to capture the natural beauty of the area, the power of the ocean and the hardscrabble way of life that was quickly disappearing in other areas. The exhibit will also consider how artists placed local populations and traditions in their context, whether it was carpenters working in the shipyards of Essex, women and children relaxing on wide sandy beaches, or fishermen and quarrymen pursuing their timeless and dangerous ways of life. Artists featured in *Rock Bound* will include Jane Peterson, Martha Walter, Gifford Beal, Leon Kroll, Marsden Hartley, and Stuart Davis. Senior admission fee is \$10.00. Bus fee: \$20.00.

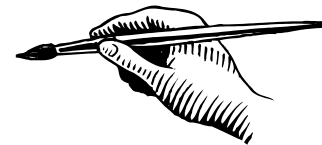

Ms. Kosich's lecture is entitled, *An Introduction to the Glacial Geology of the Concord Area*. When the glaciers of the last Ice Age left Massachusetts around 15,000 years ago, they left behind unique features that can still be seen today. The beautiful landscape around Concord contains many of these, including kettle ponds, eskers, drumlins, giant boulders, and evidence of large ancient lakes. This talk will provide a general introduction to glacial geology, illustrated with examples of glacial features from Concord and other nearby areas.

Deborah Kosich received degrees in geology from Wesleyan University (B.A. 1975) and The Pennsylvania State University (M.S. 1977). She was a petroleum geologist for 37 years, working in exploration, production, and research before retiring in Houston, TX in 2015. Her professional specialties include subsurface geology and stratigraphy. She became interested in the geology of the Concord area after her mother, June Kosich, moved to Newbury Court in 2014.
