### **FAQs about Bus Trips**

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call **promptly** when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*

## Bus Trips



**Sunday, February 4, 2:30 PM Transportation to The Umbrella Community Arts Center's Umbrella Annex at 57 ORNAC to see their production of David Mamet's *Glengarry Glen Ross*.** Senior admission is \$25.00 and you will need to purchase your own ticket at [www.theumbrellaarts.org](http://www.theumbrellaarts.org). This scalding comedy took Broadway and London by storm. Here is Mamet at his very best, writing about small-time, cutthroat real estate salesmen trying to grind out a living by pushing plots of land on reluctant buyers in a never-ending scramble for their share of the American dream. No bus fee.

**Wednesday, February 7, 10:00 AM Trip to Concord Art for Demonstration: *Color Relationships: Opening Your Eyes with Joanne Tarlin*.**

As artists, designers, and makers of fine crafts, knowledge of how color relationships is invaluable for expressing your ideas. This demo will introduce the Josef Albers exercises for seeing how colors interact with one another. Albers developed this technique at Black Mountain College and went on to teach this course at Yale School of Art; his methods continue to be taught at art schools worldwide. Using simple materials: magazine scraps, glue, a straight edge, and a razor blade, together we will create examples of how one color can appear as two. Admission is free for members, \$10.00 for non-members. No bus fee.

**Thursday, February 8, 7:15 PM Transportation to 51 Walden St. for Senior dress rehearsal of Concord Players' production of *You Can't Take it With You*.**

Admission is \$5.00, open, non-reserved seating. No bus fee.

**Friday, February 9, 10:00 AM Trip to Addison Gallery of American Art in Andover to see the exhibit, *Mark Tobey: Threading Light*. Lunch out at Samuel's afterward.**

*Mark Tobey: Threading Light* traces the evolution of the artist's groundbreaking style and his significant yet under-recognized contributions to abstraction and mid-century American modernism. With nearly 70 paintings spanning the 1920s through 1970, *Threading Light* surveys the breadth of Tobey's oeuvre and reveals the extraordinarily nuanced yet radical beauty of his work. This first comprehensive retrospective in four decades provides a thoughtful re-appraisal of Tobey's work.

One of the foremost American artists to emerge from the 1940s, a decade that saw the rise of abstract expressionism, Mark Tobey (1890–1976) is recognized as a vanguard figure whose “white-writing” anticipated the formal innovations of New York School artists such as Jackson Pollock. When Tobey first displayed his paintings composed of intricate, pale webs of delicate lines in New York in 1944, he generated much interest with his daring “all-over” compositions that eliminated narrative and three-dimensional space but retained references to the human figure.

Lunch will be at Samuel's restaurant at the Andover Inn, directly across the street from the Addison Gallery; please bring cash for lunch. Admission to the Addison is free.

**Thursday, February 15, 12:30 PM Transportation to Indian Hill Music in Littleton for free “Bach’s Lunch” concert, Come to the cabaret! With Mary Crowe on vocals and Evelyn Harris on piano.** We have two tables reserved for this show. Each table is allowed to have up to six people only – *therefore this trip will have a maximum number of twelve attendees.* Concert starts at 1:30 PM. Coffee, tea, and cookies are provided by Indian Hill free of charge, **you bring your own bag lunch**. Admission is free. No bus fee.

**Sunday, February 18, 1:15 PM Transportation to 51 Walden St. for matinee performance of Concord Players’ production of *You Can’t Take it With You*.** Alice Sycamore falls for banker's son, Tony Kirby. But when she invites her snooty prospective in-laws to dinner to give their blessing to the marriage, Alice's peculiar extended family - including philosophical grandfather Martin Vanderhof, hapless fledgling ballerina sister Essie and fireworks enthusiast father, Paul - might be too eccentric for the staid Kirbys. *You Can’t Take it With You* originally opened in 1936 and won the Pulitzer Prize for Drama. The Frank Capra film adaptation won several Academy Awards including Best Picture. **Thursday, February 22, 10:00 AM Trip to Currier Museum for a guided tour by Nancy Baker of exhibit of the Sculpture of Augustus Saint-Gaudens.**

The Currier will present the sculpture of Augustus Saint-Gaudens (1848–1907) in the first major exhibition of his work to be held in New England in more than 30 years. Saint-Gaudens was the most important American sculptor of the late 19th and early 20th century, and his monuments have become an integral part of our country’s historic narrative. The exhibition will present many of his large-scale masterpieces including *Abraham Lincoln: The Man*, the *Adams Memorial*, and *Diana*.

Saint-Gaudens transformed American sculpture by creating figures from recent history in heroic scale, with allegorical references, and in carefully designed settings. His monuments to heroes like Admiral Farragut and General Sherman defined America’s response to the Civil War. *The Shaw Memorial* took 14 years to complete and was the first public sculpture to depict heroic African-American soldiers of the Civil War. Saint-Gaudens’ *Diana* of 1893 was inspired by Greek and Roman sculpture and Renaissance art, but she became a beacon of modernity as the first sculpture to be illuminated by electric light as she balanced atop the tower on the newly erected Madison Square Garden in New York.

His home and studios are now managed by the National Park Service and this exhibition is a collaboration with the Augustus Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site.

Lunch will be on your own at the museum. Admission to museum is \$13.00.

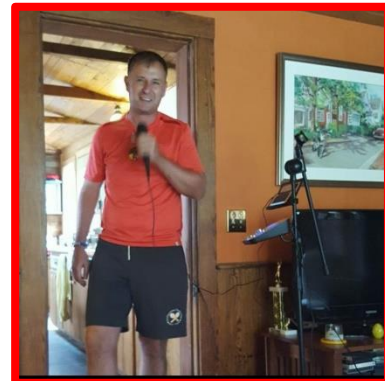
