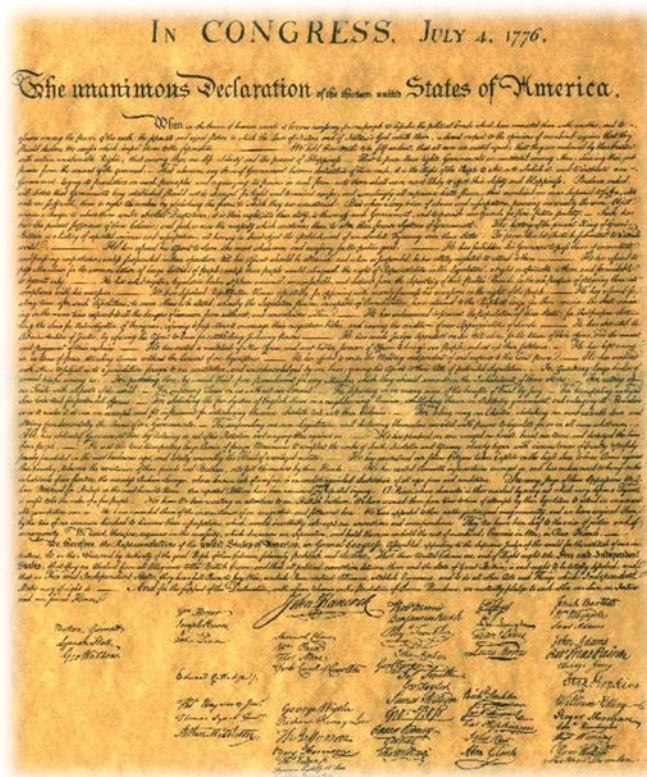

FAQs about Bus Trips

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call promptly when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel a trip **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*

Bus Trips

Mondays, July 17, 24 & 31, 1:00 – 2:30 PM Summer Walks with Jill and Sarah.

Summer's here but we're game to give a few walks a try, weather permitting. Jill and Sarah will lead a walk (up to an hour, but not that long if it's warm) in a location in the Concord and Lincoln area within a short bus ride. Possible locations might include Great Meadows, Punkatasset, Battle Road, Fairyland and more. Please wear sturdy walking/hiking boots and bring a walking stick if it helps your stability. We have several sets of trekking poles for your use as well, and they make for added exercise *and* stability! Our plan is to return to Newbury Court by 2:30 PM or shortly thereafter. Sign up is necessary. No bus fee.

Thursday, July 6, 11:00 AM Transportation to Verrill Farm.

A quick, five minute drive from Newbury Court will bring us to Verrill Farm, a newly renovated and expanded farm stand and so much more. They carry fresh produce, baked goods, an impressive array of cheeses, flowers, gift items such as jams, jellies, tea towels as well as a large, refrigerated section with precooked meals to go. In addition, they have a deli counter where you can order a sandwich or a panini and enjoy a lunch there. No bus fee.

Tuesday, July 11, 12:20 PM Luncheon Cruise down the Sudbury River

Enjoy a relaxed 1½ hour cruising and dining experience on a pontoon boat, where you might see turtles, blue herons, geese, ducks and other wildlife along the river banks. You'll also learn about and see other points of interest in Concord. Cost includes a lunch of sandwich with ice tea or lemonade, fruit and dessert. Choices are ham & cheese, sliced turkey, chicken salad, vegetarian or tuna salad. Please call Jill Crowley at 978.402.8219 with your choice by Thursday, July 6. Cost is \$37.00 per person; this includes the gratuity (please bring cash). We are also offering this trip in August. No bus fee. ***Unless there is a waiting list, residents will be charged the full price if they cancel at any time. Please note: residents must be able to walk down a ramp and step onto the boat. The boat seats are low, and residents must be able to get in and out of the seat unaided.***

Thursday, July 13, 11:30 AM Lunch Out with Fayad to Nancy's Airfield Café.

Nancy's Airfield Café in Stow is known not only as a location with interesting action going on around (small planes occasionally landing and taking off) but also as a full service restaurant with delicious fare created from locally-sourced ingredients. You will find gourmet sandwiches, burgers etc. She also features a full liquor license and makes inventive cocktails. Fayad makes everything easy and fun. Bring cash for lunch. No bus fee.

Tuesdays, starting July 18, 11:00 AM Transportation to Concord Center .

Starting on July 18 we will offer a weekly trip to Concord Center where you can shop at the various stores (Cheese Shop, Bookshop, Vanderhoof's Hardware, The Colonial Store etc.) and/or grab a bite to eat (Main St. Café, Helen's, Comella's etc.) You will be dropped off in the lot behind the Visitors Ctr and picked up in the same location. There are benches and restrooms there. ***Pick up will be promptly at 1:00 PM.*** No bus fee.

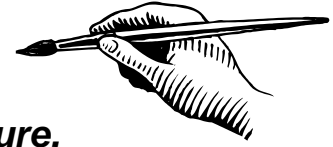

Friday, July 7, 3:00 PM **Lecture: Clockwork of Health: from Sleep to Cognition and Beyond**, Morrison Theatre. Sleep problems and dysfunction of internal circadian clock are wide spread and increase with age. They are especially damaging to successful aging, contributing to heart conditions, cancer, metabolic and mental disorders. Sleep loss and circadian misalignment alter normal daily functions and exacerbate symptoms of Alzheimer's, Huntington's and Parkinson's disease. The lecture will address the basic mechanisms of sleep and circadian clock, and ways to treat sleep and clock conditions through classical and novel techniques. Irina Zhdanova, MD, PhD, is an expert in sleep and circadian rhythms. As a Principal Research Scientist at MIT and then Professor of Neurobiology at Boston University School of Medicine, she spent over 20 years studying sleep and circadian clock system in humans and animal models.
