FAQs about Bus Trips

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call **promptly** when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel a trip **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*

Wednesday, September 6, 7:00 – 8:15 PM **Piano Jazz with Brian Friedland,** South Café. Relax after dinner with some jazz standards improvised by Brian Friedland. Self-serve wine and soft drinks will be available in the café.

Friday, September 8, 4:00 PM **I’m In The Mood For Love: The Songs of Dorothy Fields performed by Will McMillan and Joe Reid,** Morrison Theatre. You may not recognize her name, but you probably know lots of songs for which Dorothy Fields wrote lyrics such as “I Can’t Give You Anything But Love,” “Hey, Big Spender,” “Pick Yourself Up,” and “On The Sunny Side Of The Street.” Born into a show business family in 1904, Ms. Fields worked as a lyricist for almost fifty years — starting with hit songs in the 1920s for a Cotton Club revue featuring Duke Ellington right through a triumphant collaboration with Cy Coleman, Neil Simon, Gwen Verdon and Bob Fosse on *Sweet Charity* in the 1960s. She co-wrote songs with over 15 composers, including Jimmy McHugh, Jerome Kern, Harold Arlen, Arthur Schwartz, and Sigmund Romberg — and won an Academy award in 1936 with Kern for “The Way You Look Tonight.” Pianist Joe Reid and singer Will McMillan will share a bouquet of her hits — including “I Won’t Dance,” “If My Friends Could See Me Now,” “It’s Not Where You Start, It’s Where You Finish,” “Remind Me,” “You Couldn’t Be Cuter,” and “I’m In The Mood For Love” — as well as a few stories about how they came to be written.

Founded in 1995, Concordia Consort is the performance ensemble representing Recorders/Early Music MetroWest, the area's participatory early music program. For over a decade, Concordia has appeared as guest musicians at churches throughout New England. Concordia has been heard in live broadcast on WCRB, WHRB and WGBH Radio and has presented concerts in historic King's Chapel and St. Paul's Cathedral in downtown Boston, at Middlesex Community College, MIT Chapel and Williams College, for the Concord Museum, and other community concert series . Their program, entitled, *Elizabeth's Memories*, includes work by William Cornysh, Henry VIII, Thomas Morley and others. The Consort consists of Eileen Cecelia Callahan, soprano; Sheila Beardslee, director; Nouri Newman and Brian Warnock, recorders.

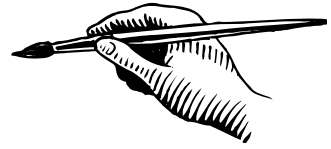

Thursday, September 28, 4:00 PM **Distinguished Speaker Series: Nancy Schön**, Morrison Theatre. “Make Way For Nancy.” In a dialogue format, Newbury Court resident Mark Hopkins will interview Nancy Schön, the Boston based sculptor known for her warm, evocative representations of human and animal figures. Her first public art commission brought her deserved acclaim. IN 1987, the Friends of the Boston Public Garden commissioned *Make Way for Ducklings*, her sculpture based on Robert McCloskey’s classic of children’s literature. In 1991, as part of the START Treaty

Summit ceremonies, First Lady Barbara Bush presented Raisa Gorbachev with a replica of her ducklings which is now in Novodevichy Park in Moscow and was given “on behalf of the children of the United States to the children of the Soviet Union.”

Schön’s career as a bronze sculptor began long before the ducklings. She has received dozens of sculpture commissions, public and private, and has exhibited throughout the United States and abroad, including 17 one-woman shows. The grants, awards, medals, board memberships, honorary chairs, appointments, acquisitions, and exhibitions Schön has earned attest to her accomplishments.

Along with her artistic career over the years, Nancy has also been a community activist. She is known as the “Grandmother” of a 40,000 square foot world-class skate park that opened under the Zakim Bridge in 2015. In addition, she has raised large sums of money for non-profit groups by designing zipper pulls, pins, pendants, small sculptures and large bronze murals as “Donor Opportunities.” Nancy married Donald Schön in 1952, and has 4 children, 11 grandchildren and one great granddaughter.
