FAQs about Bus Trips

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call **promptly** when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability. Tickets purchased for an event by the Program Dep't. are for residents only unless otherwise specified by the Program Dep't.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*

Saturday, June 1, 7:15 PM Transportation to Cary Hall in Lexington for Concord Chorus Spring Concert. They will perform the Fauré Requiem, Mendelssohn's Psalm 42 and Vom Himmel hoch. Senior ticket price is \$25.00 and can be purchased through members of the chorus who live at Newbury Court. No bus fee.

Mondays, June 3, 10, 17 & 24, 12:30 PM Spring Walks with Sarah and Jill
As always, please keep in mind that these walks are for hardy walkers; those who can walk at a moderate pace for an hour on sometimes very uneven ground.
We must insist on appropriate footwear, which means hiking boots or sturdy athletic shoes that offer support. In April we will most likely encounter mud so keep that in mind as well. Bring a walking stick if you could use the extra support, or try our trekking poles – we have several pairs! Sarah and Jill choose locations in or nearby Concord; some places we go to regularly include stretches of the Battle Road, October Farm, Great Meadows, and the Emerson-Thoreau Amble in the town forest. We arrive back at Newbury Court 2:00 – 2:30 PM. As with all bus trips, please sign up with Transportation. No bus fee.

We will visit the Acton Arboretum where there are two walking trails accessible for people who use walkers. Much should be flowering this week. Bring a snack if you like, we may stop at one of the picnic tables to rest a short a while. There are also plenty of benches along the way to stop at and rest. We will arrive back at Newbury Court at **approx.** Noon. Weather permitting. No bus fee. (*Note: we have another "walker walk" planned for 6/18.*)

Friday, June 7, 12:45 PM Trip to the International Museum of WWII, Natick.

We will leave the museum at 3:30 PM—not before—it is a very large collection. Please eat lunch before we leave. All visitors are required to fill out a waiver of liability before arriving and bring it to museum. (Jill will provide the waivers.) You must bring your ID. There is no place to eat and there is no gift shop. There is one place with seating in the lobby of the museum. ***Please be prepared to leave all belongs either on the bus or in a locker at the museum. Residents must be able to stand for an extended period of time...***(you can return to the lobby anytime for a rest). They do not provide guided tours but there is a free AudioGuide. You will see the most comprehensive collection of World War II artifacts, letters and documents in the world. More than 7,500 pieces are on display, integrating the human, political and military stories of the global war. Many durable artifacts can be handled, and touched. Museum Fee \$25.00 Bus Fee \$5.00

Saturday, June 1, 7:30 PM **Live Performance of Gilbert & Sullivan's The Mikado**, Morrison Theatre. The Greater Worcester Opera Company comes with a 28 member cast to perform *The Mikado*. Greater Worcester Opera was founded in 2003 by singers formerly associated with Salisbury Lyric Opera Company, with a two-fold mission of opera performance and education. Led by Executive Director Elaine Crane, GWO performs mainstage operas, concerts, and other musical events as well as producing touring operas for students. Most of the artists who perform with GWO are professionally trained singers who attended various conservatories and music programs in the area, and then settled down locally to make their homes in New England.

Running time is approx. 2 hrs, 20 min. which includes the intermission.

Come celebrate Spring with the Lincoln Ringers, who return to Newbury Court for a Spring concert that promises something for everyone. Join us and hear pieces that are full of rhythm, full of meaning, and full of praise! This year's selections include a piece from South Africa, a gospel favorite, and a selection commemorating the 20th anniversary of the Columbine tragedy. The Lincoln Ringers are a 14-ringer community handbell ensemble whose mission includes bringing an awareness of their musical genre to audiences in addition to a focus on performance and entertainment.

At New England Conservatory Yukiko Takagi has appeared on the First Monday series at Jordan Hall, and is a teacher and guest artist for NEC's Summer Institute for Contemporary Piano Performance. Her recent performance of Stockhausen's Natural Durations at the Met Museum was cited as "especially memorable" by New York Times.

Beginning in 1978 China launched a nearly four decade effort to transform itself into a modern market economy integrated into the world economy. There was also considerable loosening up of controls over speech and behavior as long as the rule of the Communist Party was not challenged. And China mostly stayed away from controversial foreign policy positions. For the last two or three years, however, China has reversed course along all of these dimensions at the same time that President Trump has moved away from the approach of the past six US Presidents in dealing with China.

Our speaker, Dwight Perkins is Harold Hitchings Burbank Professor of Political Economy, Emeritus, of Harvard University. Previous positions at Harvard include Associate Director of the East Asian Research Center (now Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies), Chairman of the Department of Economics, Director of the Harvard Institute for International Development, and Director of the Harvard Asia Center. Dwight Perkins has authored, coauthored or edited 24 books and over 100 articles on economic history and economic development of China and of other Asian and developing economies. He has served as a consultant/advisor to governments in Vietnam, Republic of Korea, Indonesia, Malaysia, China, and Papua New Guinea as well as to the US government, the Ford Foundation, and the World Bank.

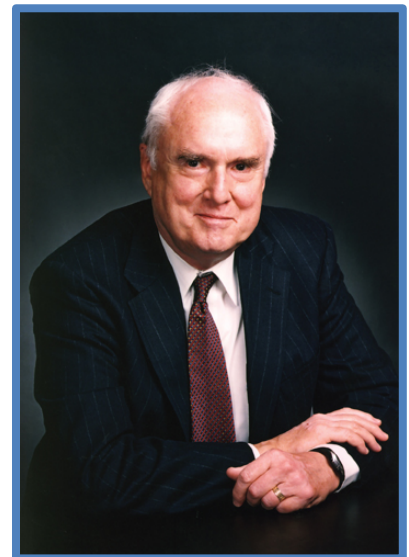

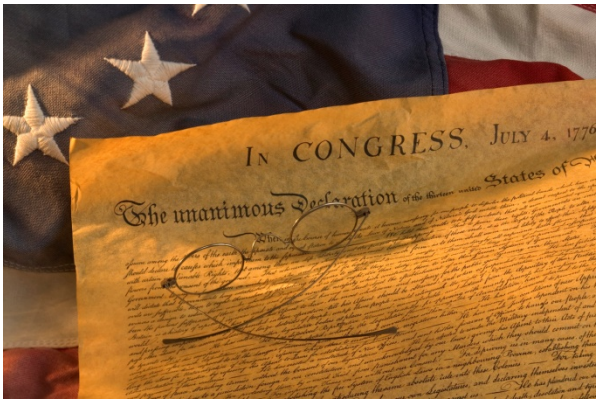
